## Our Heritage

Designed by celebrated neo-gothic architect Richard Cromwell Carpenter, the Court was built in 1848 as vicarage and architectural complement to nearby St Andrews Church. In 1940, after a brief stint as a hotel, it was bought by Carl and Eleanor Urban, who relocated from London to establish a new school promoting cooperative living and learning.

While the original School closed in 1982, the importance of discovery, developing practical skills and a focus on what's now called sustainability have remained central to Monkton's ethos.

Many visitors and guests from the School days and past generations of the community feel a profound connection to this beautiful place, a devotion we all share.

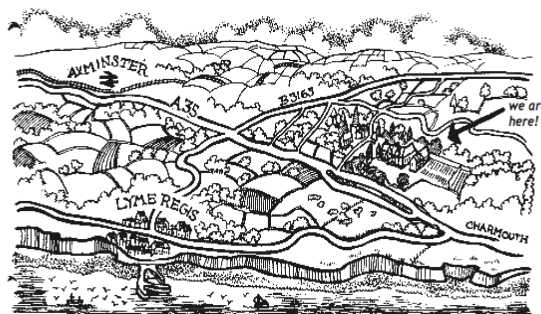
